Population Served: Clients of all ethnic groups, gender, ages 0-18 in the custody of DCFS with emotional or behavioral problems or nominal delinquent records, difficulties with interpersonal relationship issues. These clients may be occasionally aggressive, withdrawn, present low risk of harm to self or others. Population may show deficits in social skills or cognition, yet their needs can generally be met in a family setting.

Length of Stay: Child and youth placed with Brookshire have an average length of stay of 3 months to a year.

Program Description: Brookshire is a program designed to provide 24-hour family based care, supervision and treatment services. Trained staff will provide a therapeutic home environment, appropriate parenting, general guidance, skill development, supervision and behavioral management to improve a child or youths condition. These youth will have mild emotional or behavioral problems and/or nominal delinquency records, difficulty with interpersonal relationships and may require daily supervision and monitoring, behavioral treatment and other rehabilitative interventions. In addition, program designs include youth preparation for independent living. Brookshire exists to assist youth in the community by providing a secure caring environment with guidance, protection and education. Our goal is to assist the child or youth in becoming a self sufficient and contributing member of society.

Each home utilized by Brookshire will have treatment parents (an individual/couple over the age of 21) responsible for the room, board, behavior management, general guidance and supervision of each youth placed in the home. Children and Youth placed in the homes of treatment parents will be responsible for working with treatment parents on home issues along with individualized treatment plans, which have been developed by a licensed mental health therapist.

Population Served: **DLS** (facility located in West Haven): **Adolescent males** (Ages of 12 -18) who are cognitively impaired and who exhibit severe behavioral and emotional problems. To be eligible for admission, the adolescent must meet the following criteria: 1) Male, between the ages of 12 -18; 2) Have sub-average intellectual functioning; and. 3) Demonstrated behavioral and/or emotional problems related to: Aggressive and/or assaultive behavior or high frequencies of noncompliance leading to an inability to be maintained in either task centered, family, or social setting.

DRM (facility located in Ogden): **Males**, (Ages 8-12) with severe emotional, behavioral or similar disorders who require intensive behavioral treatment, structured therapeutic rehabilitative interventions and continuous monitoring. They may be aggressive or markedly withdrawn, socially isolated, present a moderate risk of causing harm to self or others or have impaired reality testing, communication, cognition or affect. Their needs can generally not be met in a family home setting and they require continuous monitoring and supervision, including intensive awake night supervision.

Length of Stay: 6 Months to 1 Year

Program Description: **DLS Services:** The program consists of a 24 hour supervised living situation involving individual and.

group based therapeutic, recreational, and skill development activities. The overall goal is to create an environment that will stabilize the youth's behavior and allow him the opportunity to learn and demonstrate skills necessary to successfully live in the community. The program is based on a social learning intervention model combined with specific behavioral intervention strategies designed to increase compliance and diminish acting-out and aggressive behavior. Overall program structure includes intensive staff supervision (minimum 1:3 day staffing, two awake overnight staff) and a formalized level system. The intensive supervision provides for increased monitoring and the ability to better hold residents accountable for their behavior. The level system is designed to promote and reward appropriate behavior with increased privileges and responsibility.

DRM Services: The program is based on a social learning intervention model combined with specific behavioral intervention strategies designed to increase compliance and diminish acting-out and aggressive behavior. Overall program structure includes intensive staff supervision (minimum 1:4 day staffing, two awake overnight staff) and a formalized level system. The intensive supervision provides for increased monitoring and the ability to accurately hold residents accountable for their behavior. The level system is designed to promote and reward appropriate behavior with increased privileges and responsibility.

DLS and DRM Services: To insure that services are delivered in a manner that is goal oriented and takes into account the individual needs, circumstances, and strengths of the youth and his family, individual service contracts shall be entered into with all residents. The service contracts require proactive participation from the youth and have clearly defined goals that are measurable, specific, and task-oriented. Decisions regarding movement through the program and, ultimately, graduation from the program, itself, are predicated upon successful completion of these goals. Contracts only focus on issues directly related to the delinquent or acting out behavior, socialization and developmentally related tasks, and skills needed for independent daily living. FTC policy is to never discharge a youth unless they successfully complete the program.

Program Description: The objective of this program is to use individual, group and family therapy to identify and correct any deficits or dynamics that might be inhibiting the normal cognitive and emotional development of the child. This would include factors both internal and external to the child. Special programming to be utilized in this process include parenting skills classes using the Parent Project, Inc. curriculum that is designed specifically for difficult to treat children and their families. Along with the parenting skills classes, family therapy using systems, structural, cognitive/behavioral, and family of origins theories will be employed with both the biological and the treatment families to create an environment conducive to change and mental and behavioral health. This will prove critical when post-treatment reunification with the biological family is the goal. Also, special attention will be given to assessing and monitoring the need and use of medications for any special needs the child may have.

In addition to the clinical services mentioned above, the treatment and biological families will be assisted in providing the children with a healthy family environment that will include an emphasis on effective communication patterns and behavioral modeling as well as appropriate emotional support. The children will also be provided with any needed educational assistance as well as exposure to new leisure and recreational activities. Finally, our commitment to quality service and the long term growth and happiness of the children and their families will provide a therapeutic relationship that hopefully will extend beyond the treatment process itself.

Program Description: Youthtrack treats cognitively impaired and non-cognitively impaired juvenile sex offenders in a community based placement, with maximum non-secure supervision and intensive clinical intervention. Youthtrack has the ability to address treatment needs for the full range of sexual offenders and provide an offense specific risk and clinical assessment. The program is able to provide services to youth that are typically more predatory and entrenched in sex offender patterns. The program meets the standards of the Network on Juveniles Offending Sexually (NOJOS) for a level 6 treatment facility. Treatment services include a constellation of modalities: offense specific treatment groups, psycho-educational groups to include, but not limited to, daily living and social skills, sex education, recreation and family groups. Treatment includes strategies for work on the youth's assault cycle, behavioral strategies to reduce deviant sexual arousal, and strategies based on the youth's assault cycle to assist in relapse prevention. Clinical services are provided or supervised by clinically licensed staff who have experience working with juvenile sexual offenders. Client staffings are held weekly. Caseworkers and appropriate other agency staff are encouraged to attend. From the time that a youth is admitted to the program, a transition plan is developed with anticipated discharge date and expected progress points identified. The treatment plan is updated quarterly and any modifications to the anticipated discharge dates or expected progress are made. As the youth moves toward discharge, a placement plan is developed that will place the youth in the least restrictive environment. Appropriate caseworkers, family members, and staff are involved in the placement decisions.

The treatment modality initially focuses on providing a loving, consistent environment where the children will learn to trust adults. Behavioral and cognitive strategies are utilized to create lasting behavior changes. Emphasis is placed on the child's ability to utilize verbal skills to replace their old coping strategies that typically range from withdrawal to aggression. Opportunities to interact with peers and play in natural settings help develop necessary social skills. Because self-care skills are typically delayed they are addressed through the daily routines of dressing, eating and bathing. This process not only enhances self-esteem but also helps the children function more independently. Permanency planning is a critical part of treatment with transitioning into appropriate homes as soon as the child is stabilized and prepared for a new family or reunification. As part of a comprehensive treatment model, The Center provides the following services based on a treatment plan developed by a multi disciplinary team: therapeutic day treatment, individual therapy, parent/family therapy, group therapy, skills development services, and psychiatric services. Appropriate supervision is provided 24 hours a day including video monitoring and a bedroom alarm system to assure children's safety and protection.

Caseworkers will have the opportunity to provide feedback on the program and treatment progress through a consumer satisfaction survey as well as be provided with quarterly reviews of treatment goals summarizing client's progress. In addition to the clinical services, MCFS is licensed to provide individual and family based residential care placements. Our mission is to provide safe, structured and supportive homes for individual and family based care. Central to the success of the children we work with will be the homes they are cared for in. Consequently our philosophy includes providing a thorough foster parent training program prior to placing a child in a home and providing on-going training and support for each foster parent as they work with and care for the child in their home. In addition, clients in our residential program will have opportunities to participate in extracurricular activities, to improve their academic performance and expectations, to be exposed to role models in the community and society and to engage in enriching experiences that will aid in improving the qualities of their lives.

ARTEC's comprehensive residential program includes on-site psychological, psychiatric, medical assessment and educational services and therapeutic recreational services. The program serves 120 youth, 6-18 years of age. Therapy and education are important components of this program; 2) A day treatment program that serves approximately 70 adolescents who live in the community, either in their own home, with relatives, or in foster care; 3) Sexual abuse evaluation and treatment services provided to identified victims and families. Treatment consists of individual and family counseling, group therapy and coordination with other agencies involved with sexual abuse victims; 4) An educational program that is a cooperative effort between Valley MH and the Granite School District. This program is highly structured and individualized and the youth typically gain 2 years of academic progress for every 6 months in the program; 5) A respite care program that provides scheduled supportive respite services for severely emotionally disturbed children and adolescents, ages 5 to 18; 6) A transitional living program offered for youth ages 17-21 in custody of DCFS and in need of transitional services into the adult mental health system. The program is a community-based apartment setting with 24-hour supervision and skills training.

We utilize a treatment program that has been developed for years by several recognized sex offender treatment specialists. It actively promotes the following:

- Program Description:**
1. **Deconstruction of Denial and Treatment Defensiveness:** The client overcomes the denial associated with the occurrence of the offense, its severity and deviancy, and its impact on the victim(s). The client learns to accept responsibility and increase their accurate awareness of their potential to re-offend.
 2. **Development of Empathy:** The client develops both a cognitive and emotional understanding of empathy relative to the victim. They come to recognize how their general behaviors impact others around them.
 3. **Understanding the Assault Cycle and Applying Interventions:** The client learns the elements and circumstances, internally and externally, that triggers their cycle and they form healthy alternatives, emotionally and behaviorally. The client comes to recognize and “catch” their thinking errors and rationalizations. The client recognizes, disrupts and avoids victim grooming.
 4. **We find indicators of progress which include internalization of therapy concepts, a positive identity and self esteem, a healthy sexual identity, an ability to examine and find alternatives to negative thoughts and behaviors, the healing of their own victimization, if any, and the development of healthy skills**

The Clearfield Home is particularly strict relative to contracted elements of treatment and does not compromise on staffing ratios, contracted therapy hours (8-9 hours per week), or firm, but caring staff to client communication. In addition to the contracted ratios/hours, etc., we run a therapist guided parent group. We have three points of emphasis at Clearfield:

1. State of the art staff training.
2. Close collaboration with the state, the family and the community.
3. Regular treatment reviews leading to individualizing treatment approaches.

The Ogden home is intended as a transition program.

Population Served: The Family Center serves youth, male or female, ages 12-17 who are struggling with hyperactivity, behavior and attitude problems, educational deficiencies, difficulty with social interaction skills and non-compliance. While the Family Center does routinely deal with drug problems, it does not work with severe drug problems, severe sexual problems and severe psychological problems.

Length of Stay: 8 Months

Program Description:

- Extended Family, Inc. is a State licensed residential treatment program consisting of two 6000 sq. ft. Family Treatment Centers located on a 3 acre campus/ranch in Spanish Fork, Utah, with several proctor support residences located throughout Utah County. Extended Family, Inc. is designed to provide psychological treatment for youth in supervised 24 hour living environments that range from the Family Center with staff members awake and on duty 24 hours per day to supervise treatment and therapy in the home of trained professional parents.
- Our daily and weekly schedule includes school, chores, work hours, individual therapy, group therapy, education time, life skills, exercise time, and self-improvement time. The basic structure of the program relies on a Levels program where youth are raised or dropped a level based on their behaviors. The Levels program gives the youth a variety of privileges and restrictions based on their level. We also offer ongoing experiential therapy to support the treatment and therapy goals.

- Our clinical staff are well trained and experienced in working with troubled youth. Dr. Terie Wiederhold and Dr. Paul Wiederhold oversee the day to day behavioral and the treatment planning for each youth. They have been working with troubled youth for over 13 years. Our therapists are equally qualified to deal with various behavioral problems. Tammy Little, LCSW, works with our youth struggling with sexual deviancy, sex identify, abusive relationships and RAD. She is also in charge of running our girl's group once a week. Tom Shults, LCSW, works with our youth who have drug or alcohol issues and who need special consideration with their ongoing addictions or experimentation. He also runs a weekly substance abuse group for all the youth needing that type of treatment consideration. Todd Powers, LCSW; Rick Adams, LCSW; and Jim Morrison, LCSW, deal with other behavioral problems such as ADHD, oppositional defiance, thinking errors, RAD, anger management and delinquency. The girl's group is run by Tammy Little, LCSW, and usually focuses on thinking errors, anger management, conflict resolution and interpersonal relationships.
- Part of our structure includes the involvement of positive role models and family involvement. We feel that it is important to include family members in treatment goals as these prior relationships help solidify the change needing to be made. Part of this support comes in the form of family visits and family therapy as deemed appropriate.
- Extended Family Inc. also includes a horse training building and several farm animals located on campus for life skills training for the youth on such things as developing responsibilities for taking care of animals and equipment. The Family Center also offers various recreation activities for youth. The opportunity to participate in these activities is earned by a reward system. The youth's willingness to behave in appropriate ways to progress in all areas of their treatment determines the level of activities they are allowed to participate in. The activities include horseback riding, boating, four wheeling, skiing, hiking, snowmobiling, camping, water skiing and many other activities.
- Our overriding goal at this treatment center is to have each youth leave better than when he or she came. We recognize that each individual needs to make correct choices in order to change their behavior; hence our desire is to help them see the benefits of leading a productive, socially appropriate life. We are confident that our staff can help facilitate this change.

Program Description: **Treatment Philosophy:** New Vista Group Home takes the position that youth can change, grow and develop when placed in a safe environment that provides a sense of respect, genuine caring, reasonable structure and limits, and recognition of individual differences, needs and strengths. Staff is available 24 hours a day for support, supervision and therapeutic intervention for all youth in all services. Accepting “clients” who display the following: separation anxiety disorder, avoidant disorders, ADD/ADHD, FAE/FAS/FDE/, ODD, conduct disorders, psychosocial disorders/lags, anxiety or adjustment disorders, disorders of impulse, childhood anti-social behavioral problems, academic problems, parent-client and other family related problems, other disorders, conditions or problems as agreed upon. The DRC level of care is for boys ages 13-18 and is designed for “lightweight” sex offenders (NOJOS level 4)

Length of Stay: Clients are expected to stay on average 3-9 months. Length of stay is directly related to skill level of the client and necessity of supervision. Turning Point has four levels of supervision. Typically a youth will be on level 1 for 1 month. On this level, client will be supervised directly by staff, unless at school. Level 2, approximately 2 months. On this level, client will be supervised by our staff or other appropriate adult supervision. On this level, the client is expected to demonstrate appropriate skills, including academics, social and life skills, such as punctuality and time management. Level 3, approximately 3 months. During this level, clients will have the opportunity to live a normal age appropriate life, while checking in with the foster parents and tracker. This level is a chance to test the youth to see if they have developed appropriate skills. Level 4 is our independent living level. Once a youth has reached this level, we will request the youth be released home, move to independent living, or go to our Excel Program. The Excel Program is designed for youth that cannot return home, but don’t need services

that require high supervision. In the Excel Program, we will reduce any of the applicable daily rates by \$10 per day. We will continue to provide appropriate levels of SDS and Tracking. Because Medicaid picks up SDS, the actual cost of the Excel program is about \$30 per day.

Program Description:

Turning Point is designed to provide quality therapeutic services for youth. Our foster parents are trained to be therapeutic foster parents. Their training far exceeds the state's recommendations. Parents are trained according to the state guidelines; additionally they are well-trained in two of the popular Boys Town Models; Common Sense Parenting and Rebuilding Children's lives. This is a combined training of about 100 hours within the first year. We believe in providing services above and beyond the norms. We take pride in the quality and competency of our parents, trackers, therapist and clinicians. We are sensitive to the needs of our clients and DCFS personnel.
